

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of the society is

Gordon Head at Lambrick Park Baseball Association.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSES

The purposes of the society are:

- 1. To foster, develop, promote and govern youth baseball activities in the community.
- 2. Subject to the needs of community youth baseball activities, to provide field space and facilities for the Greater Victoria Baseball Association's High Performance Program, the Victoria Eagles.
- 3. To encourage good sportsmanship, team play and good citizenship.
- 4. To operate exclusively as a not-for-profit, community organization providing a program of youth baseball activities.

ARTICLE III

DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution of the Association and after all outstanding debts have been satisfied, the members shall distribute the property of the association to such other organization or organizations maintaining a purpose similar to that set forth herein, which are operated as a non-profit society. This provision with reference to dissolution is unalterable.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I

INTERPRETATION

In these bylaws, unless the context otherwise requires,

- a. "association" means the Gordon Head at Lambrick Park Baseball Association;
- b. "board" means the Board of Directors;
- c. "directors" means the directors of the association for the time being;
- d. "Society Act" means the Society Act of British Columbia from time to time in force and all amendments to it.

Words importing the singular include the plural and vice versa; and words importing a male person include a female person and a corporation.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP

- 1. a. Parent Members: All parents and/or guardians of Player Members below the age of majority are Parent Members upon payment of the Player Member's participation / registration fees. Parent Members may not vote at any meeting of the Association save and except as the representative of a Player Member(s) below the age of majority.
- b. Player Members: Any person competing as a participant in the baseball programs operated by the Association shall be a Player Member. Player Members must conduct themselves in accordance with the Association's *Codes of Conduct*.
- c. The rights, duties or obligations of Player Members below the age of majority in the management or property of the Association shall be vested in the Parent Member who is the parent or guardian of the Player Member. Player Members who have reached the age of majority assume the additional rights, duties and obligations of Parent Members regardless of which person paid the participation / registration fee.
- d. Player Members shall be entitled to one vote at meetings of the Association.
- e. The voting right of a Player Member below the age of majority is vested in one of their parents or guardians (i.e., a Parent Member).
- f. Where the Player Member below the age of majority has more than one parent and/or guardian, the Association will not be involved in determining which of those parents or guardians shall be entitled to vote on the Player Member's behalf.
- g. Where a Parent Member is the parent or guardian of more than one Player Members below the age of majority, the Parent Member shall be entitled to a number of votes at meetings of the Association equal to the number of Player Members below the age of majority that they represent.
- h. For greater certainty, it is the intention of this Bylaw 1 that each Player Member shall have one (1) vote at meetings of the Association. In the case of a Player Member below the age of majority, that vote shall be exercised by one of the Player Members' parent(s) or guardian(s).
- 2. Appointed Members: A person interested in active participation to affect the purpose of the Association may apply to the Board for membership in the Association and on acceptance by the Board shall be an Appointed Member. The Secretary will keep a list of such Appointed Members. Appointed members shall be entitled to one

(1) vote at meetings of the Association.

- 3. a. Every Member (i.e., Player Members, Parent Members, Appointed Members) shall uphold the Constitution and comply with these bylaws.
- b. Any violation of the Constitution, Rules, Regulations or Policies by any Member of the Association will be sufficient grounds for suspension by the Board, by a two-thirds vote of those present at any duly constituted meeting. The Member must be notified of the intent to suspend in writing. The Board shall establish the process to be followed at the meeting but must allow the Member who may be subject to suspension a fair opportunity to address the Board at such meeting.
- c. During the term of the suspension, the Member will be excluded from all benefits extended to Members in good standing.
- d. In the case of a violation by a Player Member over the age of majority, the Board shall give notice to the manager of the team to which the Player Member belongs. The manager and/or coaches may appear before a duly appointed committee of the Board, which shall have the authority to suspend or revoke such Player Member's rights in the Association.
- e. In the case of a violation by a Player Member under the age of majority, the Board must give notice to the parents and/or guardians and the manager of the team to which the player member belongs. The parents and/or guardians, and the manager and/or coaches, may appear before a duly appointed committee of the Board, which shall have the authority to suspend or revoke such Player Member's rights in the Association.
- 4. A participation / registration fee, in an amount to be determined by the Board, will be assessed each fiscal year as a Player Member's contribution to assure the operational continuity of the Association's programs. Other categories of membership (i.e., Parent Members, Appointed Members) are not assessed participation / registration fees. The rights, duties and obligations of Player Members (or, in the case of Player Members below the age of majority, the rights, duties and obligations that are vested in a Parent Member on behalf of a Player Member) are not affected by which person actually paid the fee.
- 5. The Table Officers may waive dues or fees for a Player Member in cases of financial hardship. The Table Officers will report such decisions to the next meeting of the Board, but a waiving of dues or fees will be held in confidence. The rights, duties and obligations of Player Members (or, in the case of Player Members below the age of majority, the rights, duties and obligations that are vested in a Parent Member on behalf of a Player Member) are not affected by cases where dues or fees have been waived.
- 6. A person shall cease to be a member of the Association:
 - a. upon acceptance of a letter of resignation by the Board;
 - b. on his death or the case of a corporation, on dissolution;
 - c. on being expelled;
- d. upon the start of a new fiscal year in which no participation / registration fee has been paid;

ARTICLE III

DIRECTORS

- 7. a. The Board of Directors shall be elected by the membership at the Annual General Meeting of the Association for a one-year term of office. The Board of Directors shall assume office immediately after the Annual General Meeting in the year in which they were elected.
- b. The number of directors must be no less than 7 and no greater than 21, or a greater number determined from time to time at a general meeting.
 - c. Separate elections shall be held for each office to be filled.
 - d. An election may be by acclamation; otherwise it shall be by ballot.
- 8. The members may by special resolution remove a director before the expiration of his term of office and may elect a successor to complete the term of office.
- 9. No director shall receive remuneration for being or acting as a director but a director may be reimbursed for all expenses necessarily and reasonably incurred by him while engaged in the affairs of the association.
- 10. The directors will work directly under the President and Vice-Presidents and will be responsible for carrying out the specific duties allotted to them during the year. Any director who is absent from two (2) consecutive meetings without reasonable cause, may be asked for their resignation from the Board.
- 11. The Board of Directors of this Association will be entrusted with full control of the financial and other affairs of this Association except for the authority granted the Table Officers regarding extraordinary expenses in paragraph (23) below. The Board shall be responsible for setting policies, rules and regulations and for setting the Association's annual budget.
- 12. The Association shall not be committed to any project (excluding an extraordinary expenditure approved as provided in paragraph 23 below), financial or otherwise, by any individual or group of individuals (such as committees) until the project has been approved by the Board.
- 13. The Seal of this Association will be kept by the Secretary and used only by resolution by the Board and in the presence of such officers as may be designated.
- 14. All cheques issued on behalf of the Association shall be signed jointly by any two of the Treasurer, President, and Vice Presidents of the association. Two (2) signatures will be required on all cheques.

ARTICLE IV

ADMINISTRATION - OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

15. The President shall:

a. Preside at all Board, Extraordinary and General meetings of this Association, as well as being an *ex officio* member of all committees. He shall conduct the business of this Association in a proper manner required by this Constitution and shall have the power to cast the deciding vote in the event of a tie vote. The President is allowed one vote only at General Meetings.

- b. Investigate complaints, irregularities and conditions detrimental to the association and report his findings and make recommendations to the Board.
- c. With the assistance of the Registrar, examine the application and supporting proof of age documents of every player candidate and certify the residence and age eligibility before any player may be accepted for try-outs and selection.
- 16. The Vice-Presidents will aid the President and will be responsible for the enforcement of the Constitution. In the absence of the President a Vice-President shall be selected by the Table Officers to assume all duties relating to that position.
- 17. The Secretary shall record and prepare the minutes of all meetings and such business as deals with the Association, and will receive and reply to all correspondence pertaining to the business of this Association. He shall assure minutes of each meeting are received by the Table Officers.
- 18. The Treasurer shall keep a correct record of all financial dealings of the Association with all funds received to be deposited in a chartered bank, trust company, credit union, or Canadian Money Market Instruments in the name of the Association. He shall be empowered to obtain the services of a chartered accountant to perform an audit of the Association's books.
- 19. The Umpire in Chief (UIC) shall be responsible for administration of House Rules; shall make recommendations to the Board on matters of discipline of members, coaches, players, umpires and spectators; shall be the liaison between the Board and the umpires; shall represent the Association at meetings with other UICs from the Greater Victoria area; and shall maintain the Association's *Codes of Conduct*.
- 20. The Registrar shall be responsible for keeping all membership records and for overseeing the entire registration process and ensuring that all membership fees are forwarded to the Treasurer.
- 21. The Table Officers of the association shall consist of the following: President, Vice-President Senior Divisions, Vice-President Junior Divisions, Secretary, Treasurer, Umpire In Chief, and Registrar. All Table Officers shall be directors elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- 22. The Table Officers may at any time, and from time to time, appoint a member as a Director or Table Officer to fill a vacancy in the directors. A director or Table Officer so appointed holds office only until the conclusion of that term but is eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.
- 23. Two (2) Table Officers, upon agreement among themselves, shall have the authority to approve extraordinary expenditures of up to \$2,000.00 in addition to the normal costs of operation. One of these Table Officers shall be the Treasurer. The expenditure must be reported and approved at the next Board meeting.

ARTICLE V

MANNER OF ALTERING THE CONSTITUTION

24. Any amendments, revision or alteration to the Constitution, By-Laws and Operating Rules of this Association may only be made at an Annual General Meeting or an Extraordinary General Meeting called by the Board specifically for that purpose and of which fourteen (14) days written notice has been duly given to all Appointed Members, Player Members having reached the age of majority, and Parent Members (at the registered address of the Player Member that is represented by a parent or guardian). A request for such a meeting must be made by a fifty-one percent (51%) majority of the Board or ten percent (10%) of voting Members. No amendment or alteration may be made unless a seventy-five percent (75%) majority of votes is given the motion by those Members present and entitled to vote.

ARTICLE VI

BORROWING POWERS

- 25. This Association is permitted to borrow funds for such purposes as decided by special resolution at a General Meeting.
- 26. All debt incurred by the Association must be repaid by the end of the fiscal year in which the debt is incurred, unless specified otherwise by a special resolution at a General Meeting.

ARTICLE VII

MEETINGS

- 27. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in the month of November each year.
- 28. Every General Meeting, other than the Annual General Meeting, is an Extraordinary General Meeting.
- 29. The Directors may, when they think fit, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting.
- 30. a. Notice of a General Meeting, given in accordance with the Societies Act, shall specify the place, day and hour of the meeting, and, in the case of special business, the general nature of that business.
- b. The accidental omission to give notice of a meeting to, or the non-receipt of a notice by, any of the Members entitled to receive notice does not invalidate proceedings at the meeting.
- 31. A quorum at all Annual General or extraordinary meetings shall consist of not less than ten (10) members. If within one half hour after the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting shall be dissolved and stand adjourned to one half hour later on the same day, or such other time, date and place as the members present shall determine. At any such adjourned meeting, the Board and whatever number of members then present shall constitute a quorum and may transact the business for which the meeting was originally called.

- 32. A quorum at all Directors meetings shall be 6 directors. A fifty-one percent (51%) majority of those present is required to approve all matters.
- 33. Board of Directors meetings (a minimum of eight (8) per year) shall be held at dates decided by the President. Directors will have voting privileges and the method of voting shall be the same as indicated in Article VIII paragraph 35 (e).

ARTICLE VIII

ORDER OF BUSINESS

- 34. The order of business at all meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.
- 35. a. A Parent Member, representing a Player Member below the age of majority, present at a meeting of members is entitled to one vote.
- b. A Player Member who has reached the age of majority present at a meeting of members is entitled to one vote.
- b. An Appointed member who is present at a meeting of members is entitled to one vote.
- c. Each Director is entitled to one vote at any meeting. Where a Director also has status as a Member, that Director is only entitled to one vote.
 - d. Voting by proxy is not permitted.
- e. Voting shall be by a show of hands or secret ballot, as the majority shall decide.
- 36. A Director shall excuse themselves where they feel there is a conflict of interest on any item being voted on.

ARTICLE IX

FINANCIAL AND ACCOUNTING

- 37. The Board shall not permit the solicitation of funds in the name of the Association unless all the funds so raised are placed in the Association's treasury. Solicitation of funds must be approved by the Board.
- 38. The Board shall not permit the disbursement of funds for other than the conduct of the Association's activities.
- 39. No Director, Officer or Member of the association shall receive, directly or indirectly, any salary or compensation from the Association for services rendered as a Director or Officer.
- 40. The fiscal year of the Association shall begin on the first day of December and shall end on the last day of November.

CONSTITUTION and BYLAWS

These are the official Constitution and Bylaws of Gordon Head at Lambrick Park Baseball Association, effective upon acceptance for filing by the Registrar of Companies whichever occurs last.

The Gordon Head at Lambrick Park Baseball Association is hereby created through the amalgamation of the Lambrick Park Baseball Association (operating youth baseball programs at Lambrick Park in Saanich, BC) and the Gordon Head Baseball Association (operating youth baseball programs at Wilf Sadler Diamond and Upper Lambrick Park in Saanich, BC). Each Association, acting in accordance with its own Constitution and Bylaws, has separately agreed to amalgamate to jointly form this new Association to further the interests of youth baseball programs in Saanich.
